Wintermotoring Advice

Fact: Cars don't like winter, especially if they haven't been prepared to brave the elements! Martin Jamieson, owner of Martin Jamieson Motor Repairs, recommends the following advice to prevent your journeys over the festive season turning as nasty as the weather!

"Antifreeze (coolant) stops corrosion and protects your car against the cold, however, over time antifreeze weakens and may freeze in very cold weather. Checking your car's antifreeze can prevent the engine from sustaining serious damage. When your car is serviced at our garage we always check the strength of your antifreeze and recommend that it is changed every two years, regardless of the strength.

Batteries are the most common cause of headaches for the motorist over the winter. Low temperatures cause the battery to discharge, which leads to problems with your car starting. It is also useful to ensure the lead connections are clean and secure. Haynes manuals are an excellent resource and explain how you can check your battery.

As you would expect, window wipers are used more frequently this time of year. Wiper blades are relatively inexpensive to replace, so it is worth investing in new ones if yours appear to be worn. Word of warning – if your windscreen has frozen up do not turn your wipers on! The wiper rubbers often freeze to the screen and the rubber tears off.

As with any time of year, it is imperative that the tread on your car's tyres is adequate. There is a legal requirement that a tyre has a 1.6mm tread, although in the winter months we would recommend a 3mm tread as a minimum for optimum safety on the road.

As a final check, remove the dipstick, wipe the oil off the end with a clean rag, replace it and check again. The oil level should rest between the minimum and maximum indicators. If necessary, top up the oil until it is in between these points. Oil should always be replaced with every service.

Despite your best precautions, if snow is forecast it might be worth taking a spade, wellies, a blanket and a torch (with batteries!) in case you get stuck.

The best way to prepare for the winter is to book your car in for a winter service!














Community FreeSpace

For the last few years, the **Friends of Abingdon** have worked with the Choose Abingdon Partnership to run the "Community Shop" in Bury Street. With the wind-up of Choose Abingdon, the Friends have taken on full responsibility for it and see this as a great opportunity to help promote the wide range of community activities in the town.

The first step has been to re-name it "Community FreeSpace" – the word "shop" caused confusion as we are not actually allowed to use it to sell anything! The space is available free of charge to local community groups, charities and not-for-profit organisations for periods of up to two weeks for small-scale activities such as displays, meetings, small celebrations and generally promoting their organisation. There is no charge for community groups and small local charities; larger charities and not-for-profit organisations are invited to make a donation towards running costs.






